

TABLE MOUNTAIN

As one of the most photographed places in the world, South Africa's most iconic landmark is an inspiring and overwhelming piece of earth that hides many surprises waiting to be discovered. The mountain is home to about 2.200 species of plants and 1.470 floral species. The whole area has a biodiversity that is rear to find anywhere else in the world. With over 260 million years of age, it is older than the Andes, the Alps, the Rocky Mountains and the Himalayas. In 2012, it was named as one of the world's new 7 wonders of nature.





ROBBEN ISLAND

A trip to Robben Island, though a bittersweet experience, is a must do for anyone visiting the City of Cape Town. Usually, Islands are known for their scenic attractions and panoramic views, but this one is different. Originally, the island was used to hold or imprison political figures like Nelson Mandela, who spent nine years as a prisoner on the island, before the end of apartheid. Its name "robben" derived from the Dutch, meaning a seal. Today, the UNESCO world heritage site is still home to the second largest colony of 15.000 African penguins.



FREE WALKING TOUR

Explore the city by foot and get to know Cape Towns most interesting sights. Cape Towns Free Walking Tours are a highlight for a lot of visitors that come to the city each year. The tour guide, often a local, takes you through the city and introduces you to exquisite cultural and historical landmarks. Listen to stories about the city's rich history and heritage from slavery to the apartheid era until the present day! Participating in this walk will give you explanations and interpretations from a viewpoint you definitely do not want to miss.


A TRULY UNIQUE CAMPUS EXPERIENCE

In 2015, the University of Cape Town built a satellite campus on the site of an old cement factory in the middle of Philippi, which soon became a rising hub of education, enterprise, activity and entrepreneurship as well as a prospering business center offering unprecedented opportunities to some of the most underprivileged of South Africa's society. There are four main sites that form Philippi Village. The heart of Philippi Village is called "HUB", which is a flexible place to work, learn and socialize. It also caters as a place to hold workshops, run events or organize meet ups. You can be excited to also get to know the "Philippi Village

Container Walk" that offers businesses a working area from 13sqm and 27sqm. Entrepreneurs have the opportunity to benefit from offered business support and mentoring and make themselves a home in one of the colourful shipping containers. Another popular place is the Amphitheatre, which is a convenient place to meet up with other members of the community. The old cement factory is the fourth building on the campus and one of the oldest shooting locations in South Africa. Due to its unique look, it is a popular and highly requested site for film shoots and serves well to the growing film industry in South Africa.









CAPE TOWN'S LARGEST TOWNSHIP PHILIPPI

With more than 190,000 inhabitants living together in cramped conditions, Philippi is one of Cape Towns largest townships and the city's poorest suburb suffering from one of the highest aids infection rates in South Africa. For tourists, it is not recommended to visit Philippi township without professional guidance or local counselling. Nevertheless, a visit to a local township is an exceptional and valuable experience. Often, visitors come to Cape Town and get struck by the sight of the townships. The situations they experience on-site brings them closer to the reality of local inhabitants and the living conditions they are confornted with every day.

THE SOCIAL IMPACT DAY



CREATING A LOCAL IMPACT

At the GSB Philippi Campus, the international MBA students will be paired up with up to 30 local entrepreneurs. The day spent together should mark the starting point for what will culminate in a one year legacy program starting from 16th March 2018. In a 2-hour facilitated workshop, the invited entrepreneurs have the opportunity to present current challenges/obstacles faced on a daily basis in growing their business in a context of a Cape Town township. The MBA Students gain a clear understanding of the challenges faced by the 30 local entrepreneurs as well as a good understanding of the infrastructural, financial, social and knowledge deficit/challenges faced. Now, the rest of the day is spent working in small groups developing solution-approaches for the entrepreneurs that are creating short, medium and long term practical solutions for the entrepreneurs.



A ONCE-IN-A-LIFETIME LEARNING IMMERSION

As part of the Social Impact Day, students are invited to participate in a once-in-a-lifetime learning immersion, an entrepreneurial excursion to the township of Khayelitsha. This learning experience will provide an opportunity for the students to visit and engage with some of the most innovative entrepreneurs in the Khayelitsha community. As the biggest township in Cape Town, Khayelitsha has positioned itself as one of the city's entrepreneurial hubs. The participants will be provided with an information session to help them better understand the thought process

that goes into starting a township venture as well as some of the challenges that are faced when servicing a township market. Goal is to facilitate a cultural exchange for both the entrepreneurs and the students. We also seek to remove pre-conceived ideas and assumptions about townships and the nature of business found in these communities. Townships are not just a place of struggle, but rather they are a space of amazing innovative thinkers who give birth to life changing concepts.



LEGACY IS NOT CREATED IN A DAY

We believe that real change in the lives of our adopted entrepreneurs, their families and their communities needs to be viewed through a longterm lens. With this vision in mind, we have partnered with UCT GSB Philippi Village to use the MBA World Summit 2018 as a platform to kick-start the Impact Venture Incubation Programme. This is an 11-month programme designed and managed by UCT GSB Philippi Campus giving the Summit as well as stakeholders the opportunity to track the real impact made in these businesses. The programme is characterised by an intensive 3-month incubation period including in-residence coaching, mentorship, clinics and workshops, advisory services, co-working space and a community of peers who learn and grow. After the 3-month incubation period, the post support programme includes selected ventures receiving one-on-one support to access growth opportunities, access to investors
