Keynote-Speech



Michael Priddis CEO at Faethm

Michael started off his career in consultancy and soon began to focus on innovation related topics in strategy, markets, product, and customer experiences for service sector companies. Shortly before acquiring his

own degree at AGSM, he founded his own company S&C to focus on the integration of data-driven strategy and human-centered design for new product development. After 5 years BCG Digital Ventures took over his company and Michael became a partner to lead the founding of the Asia arm of the department. Today, Michael is the CEO of Faethm that leverages AI, robotics and the Internet of Things to design the 4th industrial revolution and the future of work. The company is working together with governments as well as major companies in 19 industries and 10 different countries.

Tim-Eisenmann-Award







The "Tim-Eisemann-Award" was named after its 2014 inaugural winner and is awarded each year to one of the 100 participating MBA students. The award is presented to the best speaker at the MBA World Summit. One who exemplifies leadership through his or her presentation at the Summit Laboratory Sessions. The recipient of this award has to be nominated and voted on by the attendees. Previous recipients have helped the community envision the future and identify paths to success. The award will be presented at an evening cocktail session at the end of the second day of the MBA World Summit.

ULTURAL EXPEDITIONS

We prepared the three following options for you to explore the city of Sydney before the MBA World Summit gets started



CITY AND COASTAL WALKS (DURATION 1-3H)

Before we deep dive into our conference we believe it is essential that you familiarize yourselves with the new environment and the new culture. For this purpose we prepared three different city and coastal walks where you can explore the City of Sydney and learn a thing or two about the rich historic background of this city and continent as a whole. All of the three walks do combine many different elements, i.e. historic building, parks, museums and memorials but also modern buildings that are shaping Sydney's profile profoundly.



TOUR 1 (START: 10 AM, TOWN HALL SQUARE)

The first tour is a walk along historic places that give a first insight on how the city developed. On your journey you will pass by places like Sydney Town Hall, the Queen Victoria building, will walk through Chinatown district, but also get the chance to learn about Australia's unique and astonishing wild and maritime lives at the Australian National Maritime Museum, Sydney Zoo & the Sealife Aquarium. But also the art lovers will get their money's worth at the Museum of Applied Arts & Sciences, or Powerhouse Museum as it is also referred to.



TOUR 2 (START: 12 PM, TOWN HALL SQUARE)

The second tour guides you along some of the most famous landmarks and UNESCO World Heritage List buildings of the city, including Sydney's Opera House. Starting out as a coastal walk, you will get a glimpse on political history while passing through the mesmerising Royal Botanical Gardens. Heading south you will visit the Art Gallery of NSW, one of the most important public art galleries of the whole country, before making your way towards the ANZAC War Memorial, situated in the Australian version of Hyde Park.



TOUR 3 (START: 02 PM, TOWN HALL SQUARE)

On the third tour you will stick more closely to the water with the sea breeze flowing through your hair while you observe the Opera House from a distance or wander through the Barangaroo Reserve. The Barangaroo Reserve is a 22 hectare reinvention of a historically significant site, integrating Aboriginal history and a modern public space for everyone. You will, additionally, get a first glimpse at our first conference venue, the Museum of Contemporary Art, but also see the The Rocks Discovery Museum as well as the Sydney Observatory.
